Pre-conference drinks reception

Ikon Gallery

The pre-conference drinks reception will be held from 6pm – 8pm at the Ikon Gallery 1 Oozells Square, Brindleyplace, Birmingham B1 2HS. The Ikon Gallery is situated in Brindleyplace, off Broad Street.

By Rail

The Ikon Gallery is a 15 minutes walk from New Street Station. From New Street station walk to Victoria Square, past the Town Hall and in front of the Birmingham Museum and Art Gallery onto Centenary Way. Continue through Centenary Square and the International Convention Centre (ICC). Walk over the bridge into Brindleyplace. Alternatively turn left in front of the ICC and right onto Broad Street, then right into Oozells Street.

Parking

The nearest car park is Q-Park Brindleyplace on Brunswick Street. For a 10% discount pre-book and quote IKON at www.q-park.co.uk.

Day 1

Wednesday 18th March, 9.30am – 16.30pm

Lecture Theatre, Birmingham School of Art, 3 Margaret St, Birmingham B3 3BX

Birmingham School of Art is located right in the city centre next to the Birmingham Museum and Art Gallery.

Walking route from New Street station

Exit the station onto Hill Street. Turn right and continue walking up Hill Street until you get to Victoria Square. Keep going alongside the Town Hall through Victoria Square until you see the Birmingham Museum and Art Gallery on your right. Walk past the main entrance and turn right onto Edmund Street. Walk along until you see Margaret Street (first left). Birmingham School of Art is situated on the right hand side.

Walking route from Snow Hill station

Exit the station onto Colmore Row. Turn left and follow Colmore Row towards the Council House. Cross Newhall Street and continue along Colmore Row until you get to Eden Place on your right. Walk down Eden Place and cross Edmund Street, turn left then first right onto Margaret Street. Birmingham School of Art is on your right.

By Rail

Birmingham School of Art is situated about ten minutes walk from both New Street Station and Snow Hill Station, where there are regular train services to and from all parts of the country. Trains run every half hour from London Euston to New Street Station - the journey time is approximately 100 minutes.

Parking

There is metered parking around Birmingham School of Art. The closest multi-storey car park is on Livery Street. Livery Street is immediate left after the railway bridge. A large multi-storey car park is situated on the left hand side of Livery Street. From there it is a short walk straight along Edmund Street to Margaret Street.

By Rail

The Curzon Building is a ten-minute walk from Moor Street Station and a sixteen minute walk from New Street Station.

Walking route from Birmingham New Street Station

Walking from Birmingham New Street Station, leave the station from the Smallbrook Queensway exit (Boots will be opposite you) and turn left, walking down the underpass. Then, cross at the traffic lights, past Moor Street Station on your right, and follow the Moor Street Queensway road, turning right when you reach the Clayton Hotel. Follow the path across another crossing and you will be on BCU's City Centre Campus - carry on straight and you will pass Millennium Point, the Parkside Building, then the Curzon Building.

Walking route from Moor Street Station

Exit the main entrance of the station and turn right. Walk along Moor Street Queensway and continue to the crossroads of Chapel Street and Jennens Road. Turn right and cross over the road, walk down Bartholomew Road and cut through Eastside City Park to Curzon Street.

Parking

There is a multi-storey car park owned and managed by Birmingham City Council situated adjacent to Millennium Point. The car park entrance is on Howe Street off Jennens Road. If you are using a sat nav please use the postcode B4 7AP.
